



DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on Typhoon "Neneng"

as of 23 October 2022, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 October 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). It became a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "Neneng" on the same day. On 14 October 2022, TD "Neneng" slightly intensified as it decelerated west southwestward over the Philippine Sea. On 15 October 2022, "Neneng" intensified into a Tropical Storm while it accelerated westward over the Philippine Sea east of extreme Northern Luzon. On 16 October 2022, "Neneng" became a Typhoon as it maintained its strength and exited PAR.



DSWD FO II through its DRMD continuously coordinated with the LSWDOs and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (LDRRMOs) in the Provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, and Batanes for significant disaster response updates.
17 October 2022	 DSWD FO II received an initial 3,000 FFPs from NRLMB in response to the request of 30,000 FFPs. DSWD FO II in collaboration with the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) member agencies particularly with the Office of the Civil Defense (OCD) Region II and Philippine Information Agency (PIA) through the assistance of the Philippine Air Force (PAF), conducted an aerial assessment in the coastal areas of Cagayan. DSWD FO II distributed hygiene kits to the internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Brgy. Centro, Camalaniugan, Cagayan.
16 October 2022	 DSWD FO II through DRMD led by OIC-Assistant Regional Director for Operations Franco G. Lopez conducted Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (DANA) in the first and second Districts of Cagayan that were affected by Typhoon Neneng. DSWD FO II through DRMD QRT rendered duty at the Regional Operations Center.
15 October 2022	 The DRMD QRT, SWADTs of Cagayan and Batanes, and MATs of the first and second Districts of Cagayan would continue to render 24-hour duty to monitor, retrieve reports, conduct assessment and assist the LGUs in addressing the needs of possible affected families due to Tropical Depression Neneng. Meanwhile, MATs of the Third District of Cagayan as well as the SWAD Teams and MATs of the provinces of Isabela, Quirino and Nueva Vizcaya are advised to be on alert to continuously

14 October 2022	DSWD FO II attended the Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Core Group meeting relative to the preparedness response of every member agency of the Cagayan Valley Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CVDRRMC) relative to Tropical Storm Neneng.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of the DSWD-DRMB is closely monitoring the effects of Typhoon "Neneng" and is closely coordinating with the concerned DSWD Field Offices for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.

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
