I. Situation Overview

On 10 October 2022 at around 11AM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. San Antonio, District 5, Dagami, Leyte. It was declared fire out at 12:02PM. The cause of fire was due to gas tank leak.


b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)
