

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flashflood Incident in Misamis Oriental

as of 18 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 October 2022 at around 3 PM, several barangays in Misamis Oriental experienced flashflood due to heavy rains brought by localized thunderstorms.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,389 families** or **11,712 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **622 families** or **3,074 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **five (5) evacuation centers** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 2).
