



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Tornado Incident in President Roxas, Capiz

as of 13 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On September 20, 2022 at around 1:30 PM, a tornado incident occurred in President Roxas, Capiz. The said incident together with the continuous heavy rain also had an impact on the livelihood of the families, who were fisher folks, residing in the affected barangays.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,078 families** or **5,390 persons** are affected in **six (6) barangays** in **President Roxas, Capiz** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱120.39 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 72,483 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 47,354 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 25,129 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 28,566 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱210.51 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.





b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

10 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) facilitated the augmentation of the remaining 504 FFPs to the affected families.
29 September 2022	 DSWD FO VI through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) and together with the concerned LGUs and Municipal Quick Response Teams facilitated the provision of food and non-food items to the affected families and/or persons.

05 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI continuously coordinates with concerned offices for significant disaster response updates and for any augmentation requests.
