



# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental

as of 11 October 2022, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 06 October 2022 at 6:25 AM, an armed conflict incident transpired in Sitio Sig-ang, Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental. The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) stationed in Himamaylan City assisted in the evacuation of displaced families and persons.

A total of 3,543 families or 16,343 persons are affected in Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental (see Table 1).

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **593 families** or **2,420 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **12 evacuation centers** in **Region VI** (see Table 2).

#### 1. Standby Funds

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 82,493 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 54,464 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 28,029 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 28,508 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱53.40 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

#### c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

10 October 2022	DSWD Field Office VI in coordination with the LGU of Himamaylan City, PNP, AFP and Red Cross visited the different evacuation centers and administered provision of financial assistance to the affected families on 09 October 2022. They conducted planning sessions with concerned LGU stakeholders to help meet the needs of the evacuees and secure safety of the vulnerable sectors such as the women, children, PWDs and senior citizens.
