

## DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Mw 6.4 Earthquake Incident in Lagayan, Abra

as of 28 October 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 25 October 2022 at 10:59 PM, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Lagayan (Abra) (17.79°N, 120.66°E - 009 km N 33°W) with a tectonic origin and a depth of focus of 11 km. The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.

A total of **46,400 families** or **153,976 persons** are affected in **377 barangays** in **Regions I, II, and CAR** (see Table 1).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **22 families** or **76 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Regions I and CAR** (see Table 2).
