

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on Tropical Depression “Maymay” as of 15 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 October 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). It became a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named “Maymay” on the same day as it remained almost stationary over the Philippine Sea. On 12 October 2022, TD “Maymay” continued to move westward while maintaining its strength. The threat of heavy rainfall continued on 13 October 2022 as “Maymay” weakened into an LPA.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

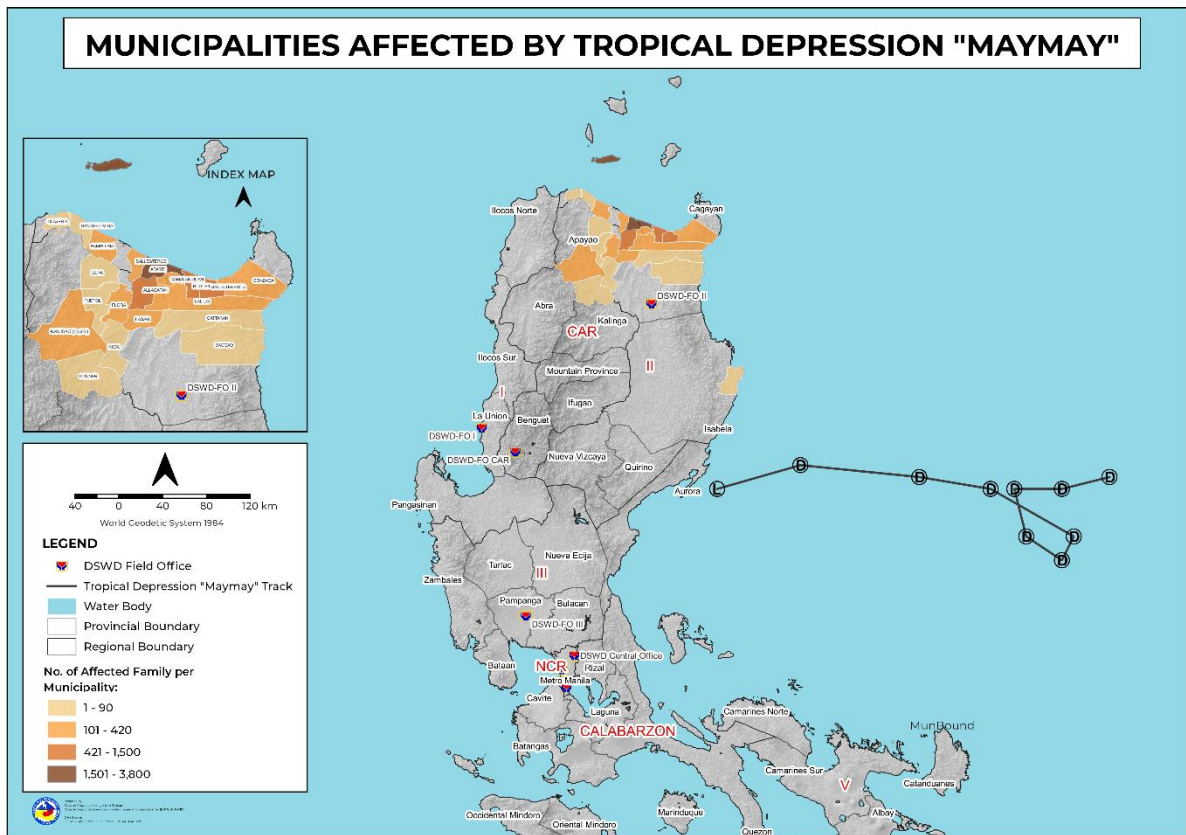
A total of **11,573 families** or **43,579 persons** are affected in **197 Barangays** in **Region II** and **CAR** (see Table 1).

The 6-wheeler wing van truck from the DSWD FO II loaded with FNIs is on its way to Lal-lo Satellite Warehouse and readily available for augmentation to the affected families. The DRMD, FO QRTs, and SWADTs conducted emergency meeting regarding Tropical Depression Maymay. The MAT Aparri conducted actual validation on the reported families affected due to flooding brought about by Tropical Depression Maymay. DSWD FO II closely coordinates with SWADTs and MATs relative to the status of affected families brought about by Tropical Depression Maymay. The DRMD of the FO II continuously coordinates with the Provincial/City/Municipal Social Welfare and Development Offices (P/C/MSWDOs) and Provincial/City/Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices (P/C/MDRRMOs) in the Provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, and Batanes for significant disaster response updates.

The Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) in the identified flood, landslide, and storm surge-prone areas were advised to undertake pre-emptive evacuation. The DSWD FO CALABARZON as the Response Cluster lead provided guidance and advised its cluster members to ensure that resources are available should the need arise. The DSWD FO CALABARZON closely coordinates with the RDRRMC IV-A Operations Center and PDRRMCs of Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, and Quezon for any updates regarding the situation. The DSWD FO CALABARZON EOC continuously conducts weather monitoring through DOST-PAGASA social media pages and disseminating the same to the members of the QRTs.
