



# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental

as of 15 October 2022, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 06 October 2022 at 6:25 AM, an armed conflict incident transpired in Sitio Sig-ang, Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental. The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) stationed in Himamaylan City assisted in the evacuation of displaced families and persons.


