

## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Flashflood Incident in Misamis Oriental

as of 22 October 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 16 October 2022 at around 3 PM, several barangays in Misamis Oriental experienced flashflood due to heavy rains brought by localized thunderstorms.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,795 families** or **13,258 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 1).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,028 families** or **4,620 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **five (5) evacuation centers** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 2).
