



DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental

as of 18 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 October 2022 at 6:25 AM, an armed conflict transpired in Sitio Sig-ang, Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental. The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) stationed in Himamaylan City assisted in the evacuation of displaced families and persons.

A total of **5,444 families** or **26,272 persons** are affected in **four (4) Barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

There are **284 families** or **1,213 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **eight (8) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 50,931 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 19,702 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 31,229 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 29,828 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱192.92 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

10 October 2022	DSWD Field Office VI in coordination with the LGU of Himamaylan City, PNP, AFP and Red Cross visited the different evacuation centers and administered the provision of financial assistance to the affected families on 09 October 2022. They conducted planning sessions with concerned LGU stakeholders to help meet the needs of the evacuees and secure safety of the vulnerable sectors such as the women, children, PWDs and senior citizens.


e. Other Activities

17 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI provided a total of ₱657,000.00 financial assistance through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) to the affected families.
13 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI through its Quick Response Teams and/or City/Municipality Action Teams assisted the City Social Welfare and Development Office of Himamaylan in the profiling of affected families and persons. DSWD FO VI through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) continuously coordinates with concerned offices for significant disaster response updates and possible augmentation requests. DSWD Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) team continuously provides technical assistance on CCCM, IDPP, and data information management to DSWD FO VI and the LGU of Himamaylan.
12 October 2022	DSWD Undersecretary for Special Concerns Vilma B. Cabrera, Asst. Secretary for Disaster Response Management Group (DRMG) Diana Rose S. Cajipe, Asst. Secretary for Visayas Affairs Evelyn B. Macapobre, DSWD FO VI Regiona Director Atty. Carmelo N. Nochete, and ARDO Erwin Razo, held a meeting relative to the distribution of financial assistance to the affected families.
11 October 2022	DSWD Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) team, in coordination with the DRMD FO VI and CSWDO of Himamaylan, conducted monitoring of the designated evacuation centers.
09 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI Regional Director Atty. Carmelo N. Nochete together with Assistant Regional Director for Operations Arwin O. Razo, Assistant Regional Director for Administration Joselito Estember, Disaster Response Management Division OIC-Division Chief Judith Tanate-Barredo, CIS Section Head, Lisa Camacho and in coordination with LGU Himamaylan City, PNP, AFP, and Red Cross visited the different evacuation centers and facilitated the release of financial assistance. The team conducted planning sessions with concerned LGU stakeholders to help meet the needs of the evacuees and secure protection of the vulnerable sectors such as the women, children, PWDs and senior citizens. DSWD FO VI DRMD Division Chief, Judith Tanate-Barredo facilitated Psychological First Aid (PFA) to the children in the evacuation centers.
