



DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy.Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental

as of 22 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 October 2022 at 6:25 AM, an armed conflict transpired in Sitio Sig-ang, Brgy. Carabalan, Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental. The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) stationed in Himamaylan City assisted in the evacuation of displaced families and persons.

A total of **5,444 families** or **26,272 persons** are affected in **four (4) Barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **1,728 families** or **5,963 persons** sought temporary shelter in **29 evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱762.73 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 49,659 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 24,030 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 25,629 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 38,630 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱222.3 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

17 October 2022	The LGUs, other government agencies, and partners regularly provided hot meals and other NFIs to the affected families.
07 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI through City/Municipal Action Team (C/MAT) and Quick Response Team (QRT) provided FFPs and sleeping kits to families staying in evacuation centers. The LGU of Himamaylan City provided hot meals to the affected families.

c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

11 October 2022	DSWD Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) staff, assisted by DSWD FO VI in coordination with the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of the LGU of Himamaylan City, conducted ocular visit and site inspection to designated evacuation centers in Himamaylan City.
09 October 2022	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the LGU of Himamaylan City, Philippine National Police (PNP), AFP, and Red Cross visited the different evacuation centers and administered the provision of financial assistance to the affected families. They conducted planning sessions with concerned LGU stakeholders to help meet the needs of the displaced families and persons, and ensure safety of the vulnerable sectors such as women, children, persons with disabilities (PWDs), and senior citizens.





d. Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) Protection

09 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI DRMD OIC-Division Chief Judith Tanate-Barredo facilitated the provision of PFA to the children in the evacuation centers.

e. Other Activities

20 October 2022	DSWD FO VI through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) continuously coordinates with concerned offices for significant disaster response updates and any request of relief augmentation.
17 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI provided a total of ₱657,000.00 financial assistance through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) to the affected families.
13 October 2022	 DSWD FO VI through its QRTs and C/MATs assisted the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of Himamaylan City in the profiling of affected families and persons. The CCCM Team of DSWD Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) provided technical assistance on CCCM, IDP Protection, and Information Management to DSWD FO VI and the LGU of Himamaylan City.
12 October 2022	DSWD Undersecretary for Special Concerns Vilma B. Cabrera, Assistant Secretary for Disaster Response Management Group (DRMG) Diana Rose S. Cajipe, Assistant Secretary for Visayas Affairs Evelyn B. Macapobre, DSWD FO VI Regional Director Atty. Carmelo N. Nochete, and Assistant Regional Director for Operations Arwin Razo, held a meeting relative to the distribution of financial assistance to the affected families.
11 October 2022	The CCCM Team of DSWD DRMB in coordination with the DRMD FO VI and CSWDO of Himamaylan City conducted monitoring of the designated evacuation centers.
09 October 2022	DSWD FO VI Regional Director Atty. Carmelo N. Nochete together with Assistant Regional Director for Operations Arwin O. Razo, Assistant Regional Director for Administration Joselito Estember, DRMD OIC-Division Chief Judith Tanate-Barredo, Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) Section Head, Lisa Camacho in coordination with the LGU of Himamaylan City, PNP, AFP, and Red Cross visited the different evacuation centers and facilitated the release of financial assistance. The team conducted planning sessions with concerned LGU stakeholders to help meet the needs of the displaced families and persons, and ensure protection of the vulnerable sectors such as the women, children, PWDs and senior citizens.
06 October 2022	The LGU of Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental in coordination with the AFP conducted assessment and road checkpoints.
