



DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on Typhoon "Neneng"

as of 20 October 2022, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 October 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). It became a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "Neneng" on the same day. On 14 October 2022, TD "Neneng" slightly intensified as it decelerated west southwestward over the Philippine Sea. On 15 October 2022, "Neneng" intensified into a Tropical Storm while it accelerated westward over the Philippine Sea east of extreme Northern Luzon. On 16 October 2022, "Neneng" became a Typhoon as it maintained its strength and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).



The Municipal Action Teams (MATs) of Cagayan continuously conducts actual validation of the flooded areas and monitors the status of families and individuals inside the evacuation centers for any concern that needs to be addressed by the office; DSWD FO II ensures adequate prepositioning of FNIs to LGUs and to DSWD satellite warehouses.
18 October 2022	 DSWD FO II Regional Director Lucia Suyu-Alan spearheaded the Cagayan Valley Disaster Risk Reduction (CVDRRMC) Response Cluster Meeting. 
