

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Western Bicutan, Taguig City

as of 05 November 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 31 October 2022 at around 11:13 AM, a fire incident occurred at Purok 9 PNR Site, Western Bicutan, Taguig City. The fire was declared out at 1:16 PM.
