



# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 26 November 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 16 November 2022, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorm brought by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) may have caused possible flashfloods or landslides due to moderate with at times heavy rains to Caraga, Davao Region, and SOCCSKSARGEN.

At 4PM on 26 November 2022, ITCZ affecting Mindanao and Palawan.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 312 families or 1,238 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 10 evacuation centers in Regions XI and XII (see Table 2).

## 1. Standby Funds

- ₱665.63 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱15.09 million available at DSWD FOs VIII, XI, and XII.
- ₱68.16 million in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the Effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 101,458 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 96,746 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 4,712 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 69,692 FFPs available at DSWD FOs VIII, XI, and XII.
