



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Moises Padilla and Isabela, Negros Occidental

as of 03 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 November 2022 at around 5:30AM, an armed conflict transpired at the boundaries of Brgy. Quintin Remo, Moises Padilla and Brgy. Sebucuan, Isabela, Negros Occidental between the Government Troops and the members of the New People's Army.

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 64,997 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 60,285 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 4,712 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 21,394 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱244.24 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
