



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 10 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 10 December 2022 at 3PM, the center of Tropical Depression "Rosal" was estimated based on all available data at 295 km East of Infanta, Quezon (15.0°N, 124.4°E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness up to 55 km/h. It is moving North Northwestward at 15 km/h. Shear Line affecting eastern section of Northern Luzon.

A total of **202 families** or **870 persons** are affected in the Province of **Apayao** in **CAR** (see Table 1).
