

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Shear Line as of 10 December 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 10 December 2022 at 3PM, the center of Tropical Depression "Rosal" was estimated based on all available data at 295 km East of Infanta, Quezon (15.0°N, 124.4°E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness up to 55 km/h. It is moving North Northwestward at 15 km/h. Shear Line affecting eastern section of Northern Luzon.
