

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Cabug, Medina, Misamis Oriental

### I. Situation Overview

On 08 December 2022 at around 1:32 PM, a fire incident occurred in Purok 2 Brgy. Cabug, Medina, Misamis Oriental. The fire was declared out at around 4:00 PM.
