

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Road Cut Incident due to Soil Erosion and Flooding in Calanasan, Apayao

as of 05 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15-16 October 2022, incidents of flooding and soil erosion due to heavy rains brought by Typhoon “Neneng” have caused the closure of road lines in the Municipality of Calanasan, Apayao.
