

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Tropical Depression Rosal

as of 11 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 11 December 2022 at 5PM, “ROSAL” maintains its strength as it moves Northeastward over the Philippine sea.


Hazards affecting Land Areas

Heavy Rainfall:

- Aside from the rainshowers caused by the trough of ROSAL, the tropical depression is less likely to bring heavy rains in the country throughout the forecast period.

Severe Winds:

- Aside from the rainshowers caused by the trough of ROSAL, the tropical depression is less likely to bring heavy rains in the country throughout the forecast period.



Hazards affecting Coastal Waters

- Under the influence of the surge of the Northeast Monsoon partly enhanced by ROSAL, a marine gale warning is in effect over the seaboard of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #25 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- In the next 24 hours, the combined effects of the surge of the Northeast Monsoon and the tropical cyclone may also bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 3.5 m) over the seaboard of Central Luzon and the eastern and western seaboard of Southern Luzon. These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

Track and Intensity Outlook

- Tropical Depression (TD) “ROSAL” is forecast to move generally northeastward or east northeastward today through Tuesday morning before turning generally south southeastward. In the near term, ROSAL may still intensify into a low-end tropical storm within 24 hours. However, increasingly unfavorable conditions associated within the monsoon surge by late Monday will result in a weakening trend. ROSAL may become a post-tropical low embedded along the leading edge of the monsoon surge by late Tuesday or Wednesday.

The center of Tropical Depression (TD) “ROSAL” was estimated based on all available data at 505 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.5 °N, 126.5 °E) moving Northeastward at 15 km/h with a maximum sustained winds 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.


