I. Situation Overview

On 18 January 2023 at around 5:00 PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental.

There are **100 families** or **497 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Binulig Elementary School** in **San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).

- 73,673 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 55,467 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 18,206 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

- ₱323.78 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
