



# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Northeast Monsoon in Region II

as of 05 January 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 17 December 2022, cloudy skies with rains caused by the Northeast Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, Aurora, and the northern portion of Quezon. Due to the weather disturbance, fishing boats and other small sea craft were advised economically affecting the livelihood of the fisher folks in the affected areas.

A total of 1,285 families or 4,544 persons are affected in 21 barangays in the provinces of Cagayan and Isabela (see Table 1).
