

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of the Trough of LPA in Northern Mindanao

as of 03 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 02 January 2023 at 11 PM, the Trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) would bring moderate to heavy rains over Caraga and Davao Region. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains would be experienced over Eastern Visayas, Northern Mindanao, and Zamboanga Peninsula.
