I. Situation Overview

On 05 January 2023 at 9:51 AM, a fire incident occurred at Brgy. Culiat, Quezon City. The fire was declared under control at 3:17 PM.

- 81,038 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 62,932 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 18,106 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 7,259 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱279.29 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
