### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 96,795 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 66,589 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 30,206 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

- ₱382.06 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO I warehouse.
