I. Situation Overview

On 20 August 2022 at around 12:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Punta Taytay, Bacolod City, Negros Occidental. It was declared fire out at 1:05 PM. The cause of fire is due to faulty electrical wires.

1. Standby Funds
