I. Situation Overview

On 22 December 2022 at around 5:29 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Maysilo, Malabon City. The fire was declared out at around 7:21 PM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱56.50 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 60,905 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 39,399 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 21,506 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 10,139 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱50.42 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
