

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Bicol Region

as of 19 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued at 11 AM on 18 December 2022, the Shear Line was forecasted to bring moderate to heavy rains over Bicol Region and southern portion of Quezon. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains was expected over Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Romblon, Aklan, Capiz, Iloilo, and the rest of Quezon. Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall.
