



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Brgy. Agusan, Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental

as of 30 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 January 2023 at 9:50 PM, a flooding incident due to localized thunderstorms occurred at Zone 3 and Zone 7 of Brgy. Agusan, Cagayan de Oro City. Reports from the City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (CDRRMO) of the LGU of Cagayan de Oro City indicates that the water subsided at around 11PM.

A total of 273 families or 989 persons are affected in Brgy. Agusan, Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental (see Table 1).

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There were **273 families** or **989 persons** who took temporary shelter in **one (1) evacuation center** in **Cagayan de Oro City** (see Table 2). These families have returned home when the flood subsided.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 69,125 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 12,119 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 57,006 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
