

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incidents in MIMAROPA

as of 29 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.

A total of **3,280 families** or **15,058 persons** are affected in **53 barangays** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 1).

There are **1,065 families** or **4,524 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **33 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 2).

28 December 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with the LGUs for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation. • DSWD FO MIMAROPA regularly monitored the local weather conditions through coordination with its Social Welfare and Development Team (SWADT) Offices, Quick Response Teams (QRTs), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (LDRRMOs), and Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs), and advisories issued by DOST-PAGASA, Department of Environment and Natural Resources – Mines and Geosciences Bureau (DENR-MGB), and other warning agencies.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO MIMAROPA for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
