



# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental

as of 20 January 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 18 January 2023 at around 5:00 PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental resulting to the displacement of the families and individuals in neighboring barangays.

A total of **210 families** or **885 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **95 families** or **489 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).

## IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}109,000.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}75,000.00\$ was provided by the Local Government Unit (LGU), and \$\mathbb{P}34,000.00\$ from the Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Table 5).






#### e. Other Activities
