



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Northeast Monsoon in Region II

as of 07 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 December 2022, cloudy skies with rains caused by the Northeast Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, Aurora, and the northern portion of Quezon. Due to the weather disturbance, fishing boats and other small sea craft were advised economically affecting the livelihood of the fisher folks in the affected areas.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 1,636 families or 5,560 persons are affected in 32 barangays in the provinces of Cagayan, Isabela and Quirino (see Table 1).

05 January 2023	 DSWD FO II approved the request of the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Divilacan, Isabela for the utilization of the prepositioned 1,000 FFPs amounting to P512,000 to be augmented to families whose livelihood is affected by the Northeast Monsoon. DSWD FO II ensures the availability of food and non-food items. DSWD FO II personnel were advised to be on standby/on-call status.
27 December 2022	DSWD FO II spearheaded by Regional Director Lucia Suyu-Alan attended the emergency meeting on the effects of Northeast Monsoon and Shear Line.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO II for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
