

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of the Trough of LPA in Mindanao as of 04 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 02 January 2023 at 11 PM, the Trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) would bring moderate to heavy rains over Caraga and Davao Region. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains would be experienced over Eastern Visayas, Northern Mindanao, and Zamboanga Peninsula.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱24.52 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5.24 million available at DSWD FO X.
- ₱70.31 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of the Trough of LPA through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 94,960 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 76,854 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 18,106 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 53,950 FFPs available at DSWD FO X.
- 436,388 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of the Trough of LPA through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱237.61 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
