

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Molo, Iloilo City as of 01 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 January 2023 at around 4:37 AM, a fire incident occurred in Barangays West Habog-Habog and San Juan in Molo, Iloilo City. It was declared fire out at around 6:16 AM.

The distribution of these relief items were spearheaded by DSWD FO VI Regional Director Carmelo N. Nochete, Assistant Regional Director for Operations Arwin O. Razo, and Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) Officer-in-Charge (OIC)-Chief Judith T. Barredo. • The LGU of Iloilo City provided FNIs to the displaced families and persons.
