



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental

as of 14 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 January 2023 at 9:50 PM, a flooding incident due to localized thunderstorms occurred in Barangays Agusan and Puerto in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental. Reports from the City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (CDRRMO) of the LGU of Cagayan de Oro City indicates that the water subsided at around 11PM.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 11 families or 47 persons are affected in two (2) barangays in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There were 11 families or 47 persons who took temporary shelter in two (2) evacuation centers in Cagayan de Oro City (see Table 2). These families have returned home when the flood subsided.

A total of \$\mathbb{P}119,839.50\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}83,286.50\$ from DSWD and \$\mathbb{P}36,553.00\$ from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Table 4).
