

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incidents in MIMAROPA

as of 30 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.

A total of **3,442 families** or **15,713 persons** are affected in **53 barangays** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 1).

There are **766 families** or **3,413 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **24 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 2).
