



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incidents in MIMAROPA

as of 30 December 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.

There are **766 families** or **3,413 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **24 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱24.52 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6.1 million available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 93,605 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 73,999 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 19,606 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 54.292 FFPs available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.
- ₱277.45 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO MIMAROPA warehouses.

c. Other Activities

30 December 2022	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinates with the LGUs for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation. DSWD FO MIMAROPA regularly monitors the local weather conditions through coordination with its Social Welfare and Development Team (SWADT) Offices, Quick Response Teams (QRTs), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (LDRRMOs), and Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs), and advisories issued by DOST-PAGASA, Department of Environment and Natural Resources – Mines and Geosciences Bureau (DENR-MGB), and other warning agencies.

29 December 2022	 Affected families with damaged houses were referred to DSWD FO MIMAROPA's Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) for provision of additional relief intervention.
