



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental

as of 21 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 18 January 2023 at around 5:00 PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental resulting to the displacement of the families and individuals in neighboring barangays.

A total of **118 families** or **587 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3)** evacuation centers in Negros Occidental (see Table 2).

Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided IV.

A total of **P691,540.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱481,540.00 was provided by the DSWD, ₱145,000.00 was from the Local Government Unit (LGU), and ₱65,000.00 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Table 5).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱23.75 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 96,795 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 66,589 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 30,206 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 37,833 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱106.07 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

19 January 2023	 DSWD FO VI through its Disaster Response Information Management Section (DRIMS) continuously monitors and coordinates with concerned offices for significant disaster response updates and augmentation requests.
