

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flooding Incidents in MIMAROPA

I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.
