I. Situation Overview

On 03 January 2023 at around 5:30 AM, a tornado was experienced in several barangays in Arevalo, Iloilo City and Oton, Iloilo

A total of **271 families** or **1,319 persons** are affected in **five (5) barangays** in **lloilo** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 81,038 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 62,932 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 18,106 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 21,547 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱295.19 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
