



DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Ms 5.3 Earthquake Incident in Leyte, Leyte

as of 08 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 January 2023 at 8:28 PM, a 5.3-magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Leyte, Leyte (11.33°N, 124.54°E - 007 km S 55° E) with a tectonic origin and a depth of focus of 001 km. The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

25 January 2023	DSWD FO VIII released additional 700 FFPs and 106 sets of non-food items (8 family kits, 8 hygiene kits, 8 kitchen sets, 8 sleeping kits and 74 tarpaulins) to the affected families with damaged houses due to the earthquake incident
19 January 2023	DSWD FO VIII facilitated the distribution of 500 FFPs and a total of 65 sets of NFIs (13 family kits, 13 hygiene kits, 13 kitchen sets, 13 sleeping kits and 13 Uratex foams) as augmentation support to the affected families and with damaged houses in Leyte, Leyte
