

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of LPA as of 08 January 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 02 January 2023 at 11 PM, the Trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) was forecasted to bring moderate to heavy rains over Caraga and Davao Region. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains would be experienced over Eastern Visayas, Northern Mindanao, and Zamboanga Peninsula.

On 05 January 2023 at 4 PM, the LPA was estimated based on all available data at 410 km West Northwest of Coron, Palawan (12.7°N, 116.5°E).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **53,025 families** or **225,925 persons** are affected in **340 barangays** in **Regions III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VIII, X, XI, and Caraga** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **4,136 families** or **17,488 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **80 evacuation centers** in **Regions III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, XI,** and **Caraga** (see Table 2).
