I. **Situation Overview**

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,895,924.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱2,691,500.00 from DSWD, ₱185,979.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), and ₱18,445.00 from the other Partners (see Table 6).

04 January 2023	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinates with the LGUs for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation. DSWD FO MIMAROPA regularly monitors the local weather conditions through coordination with its Social Welfare and Development Team (SWADT) Offices, Quick Response Teams (QRTs), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (LDRRMOs), and Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOS), and advisories issued by DOST-PAGASA, Department of Environment and Natural Resources – Mines and Geosciences Bureau (DENR-MGB), and other warning agencies.
29 December 2022	 Affected families with damaged houses were referred to DSWD FO MIMAROPA's Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) for provision of additional relief intervention.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO MIMAROPA for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
