



DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental

27 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 18 January 2023 at around 5PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. San Jose, Sipalay City, Negros Occidental resulting to the displacement of the families and individuals in neighboring barangays.

A total of **210 families** or **885 persons** were affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

A total of **118 families** or **547 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3)** evacuation centers in Negros Occidental (see Table 2).
