

DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Flooding Incidents in MIMAROPA

20 September 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2022, several municipalities in the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan experienced flooding due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon.
