

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in the Province of Quezon

as of 08 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 January 2023, an armed conflict transpired in Brgy. Poblacion, San Andres, Quezon between the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and members of the Communist Terrorist Group-New People's Army (CTG-NPA). In a hot pursuit operation on 29 January 2023, the AFP and the Quezon Police Provincial Office (QPPO) joined forces and chanced upon the group of CTG-NPA in the vicinity of Huyon-Uyon, San Francisco, Quezon which resulted to a gun fight.

A total of **230 families** or **549 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in the **Province of Quezon** (see Table 1).

02 February 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the LSWDOs of the affected LGUs for any needed augmentation such as relief items and provision of psychosocial support to the affected families and individuals. • The Rapid Assessment Team of the Provincial QRT in the Province of Quezon were advised to be on standby for possible deployment to the affected areas.

31 January 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) of DSWD FO CALABARZON, together with the QRTs, was placed on heightened alert status to monitor the effects of the hot pursuit operations. • Members of the Municipal Action Teams (MATs) in San Andres and San Francisco, Quezon were deployed to conduct data gathering and validation. • The EOC of DSWD FO CALABARZON advised the Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) of the affected LGUs to review their respective CCCM, IDP Protection, and FNI Cluster plans, and ensure that COVID-19 safety protocols are incorporated. • The EOC of DSWD FO CALABARZON closely coordinated with the LSWDOs of the affected LGUs for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO CALABARZON for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
