- ₱432.74 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO X warehouses.

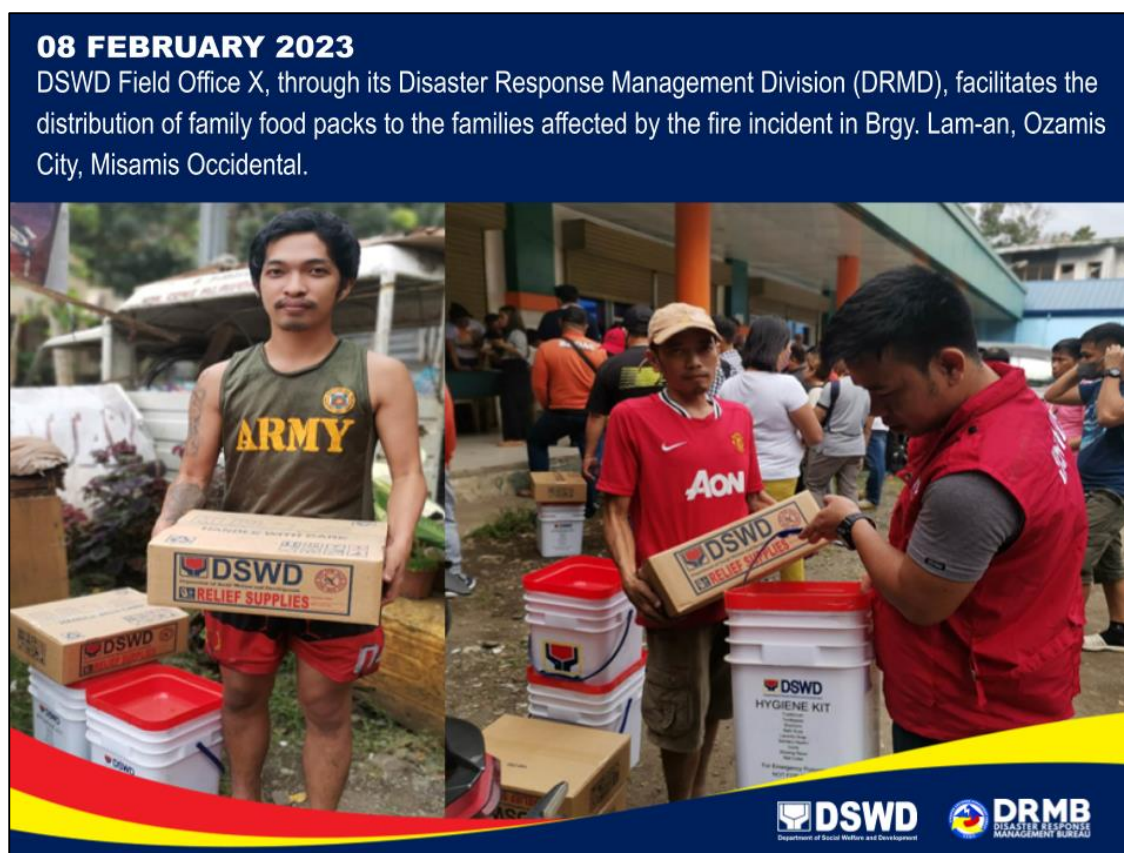
b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)
