I. Situation Overview

On 07 February 2023 at around 3:20 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Lam-an, Ozamis City, Misamis Occidental. The fire was declared out at 5PM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱758.09 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 145,516 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 54,748 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 90,768 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 71,311 FFPs available at DSWD FO X.

08 February 2023	 The DSWD FO X, through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD), provided relief items such as FFPs and hygiene kits to the affected families and individuals. DSWD FO X continuously coordinated with the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of the LGU of Ozamis City for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation.
