I. Situation Overview

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 106,374 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 29,868 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 76,506 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 52,752 FFPs available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.

c. Other Activities

01 February 2022	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA through its Social Welfare and Development Office (SWADO) in Palawan immediately conducted intake interview and assessment of the affected families. The City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City in coordination with the City Action Team, City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO), Philippine National Police (PNP), Philippine Red Cross, and Barangay Council of Mandaragat conducted house visitation to further assess the situation of the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO MIMAROPA for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
