### I. Situation Overview

On 17 February 2023 at around 11:53 AM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Pahanocoy, Bacolod City, Negros Occidental. It was declared fire out at 12:20 PM. The cause of fire is due to unattended kitchen stove.
